## **KENNETH E. ALLISON** *Class of 1977*

An innovative leader, East Moline native Kenneth E. Allison thrived as the pioneering black program manager at the Colorado Department of Public Health. He contributed to improved health care by inspecting facilities and federal health services at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid. An active Alpha Phi Alpha Brother, Allison is distinguished for his charitable work including Thanksgiving food drives, education tutoring, sponsoring aspiring college students, and cancer research. He has held vital roles including vice president of the AFGE AFL-CIO Local 1923 and treasurer for Eta Sigma Gamma. He presented crucial Afro-American concerns at the Congressional Black Caucus and Governor's Council on Physical Fitness. From mentoring future college graduates, military candidates and children at Big Brothers Big Sisters, to lettering in state championship track at Black Hawk College, Allison's achievements are invaluable.



## **KAY HAZEN** *Attended 1973-74*

As a student at Black Hawk College, Kay Hazen created content for local TV and was a DJ for the college radio station. In 1974, she was recruited out of college by Galesburg Cottage Hospital to develop educational materials. In 1986, she joined Desert Hospital in Palm Springs, California, as a top administrator. In 1992, she became vice president for Mine Reclamation Corp. In 2000, Hazen launched her public affairs firm.

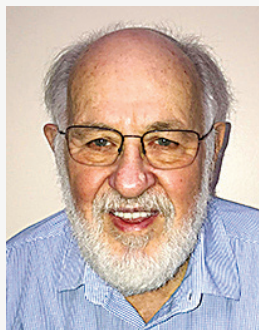


She has partnered with numerous public and private entities on diverse projects including solar initiatives, higher education access and the Salton Sea restoration.

For 18 years, Hazen was on the board of Desert Healthcare District. She co-founded the Coachella Valley Economic Partnership, the Regional Access Project Foundation and Friends of the Desert Mountains land trust. Hazen chaired the Palm Springs International Film Festival among others and was awarded the Corporate Athena Award for leadership. In 2023, Palm Springs Life magazine presented her a Lifetime Achievement Award.

## **ROBERT "RB" THOMPSON** *Class of 1962*

Moline native RB Thompson, a retired math teacher and cross country coach from Woodstock High School, has made multi-fold contributions to education and community service. He's held presidencies at the Illinois Council of Mathematics Teachers and the Northern Illinois Association of Teachers of Mathematics and served on the Illinois State Board of Education advisory on math issues. His coaching accolades include a dual meet record of 331-104-3 and leading his girls team to the national second place in the Track & Field News Postal Meet. He spent more than two decades as a Parks and Recreation commissioner and a long-term city council member, headed McHenry County Peace & Friendship Festival and served as a Court-Appointed Special Advocates president. With diverse experiences, including a stint as a Peace Corps volunteer and coach from his college days, Thompson's life has been an exceptional blend of academia, sports and service.

The Black Hawk College Quad-Cities Foundation honored and celebrated our scholarship donors and students in September at our annual Scholarship Recognition Banquet.

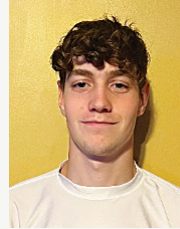

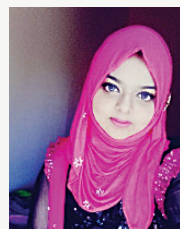

## CARING FOR OTHERS INSPIRES \$250,000 NURSING SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

This fall, the Black Hawk College Foundation announced the creation of a \$250,000 endowment for the James Cobin Class of 1976 Endowed Scholarship for full-time nursing students at Black Hawk College.

The endowment was created in memory of James Cobin, who graduated from Black Hawk College's nursing program in 1976 then worked as a nurse at Moline Lutheran Hospital. Cobin passed

away in 2017. His husband, Stanley Anderberg, who graduated from Black Hawk College and Western Illinois University, created the endowment in his memory.

During college, Anderberg met Cobin while on a trip to Germany. Cobin, a native of New York state, was stationed in Germany with the U.S. Army. After college, Anderberg worked for Deere Harvester Works in East Moline. During the farm implement crisis of the 1980s, Anderberg lost his factory job and returned to college to earn a degree in respiratory therapy. Eventually, Cobin joined Anderberg in the Quad Cities and enrolled at Black Hawk College.

As a male in the nursing field, Cobin was a pioneer at a time when fewer than 3% of nurses were male. He served as the president of his nursing class and was known for his passion for nursing and his compassion for others. Cobin's niece, Dr. Wendy Hilton-Morrow, described him as someone who saw nursing not as a profession, but as a calling. "Black Hawk College was important to both of them," Dr. Hilton-Morrow said.

The James Cobin Class of 1976 Endowed Scholarship will benefit Black Hawk College nursing students for years to come. Anderberg's decision to create the endowment reflects his and Cobin's shared love for Black Hawk College and their dedication to helping others. Both Anderberg and Cobin had careers in health care, with Anderberg working as a respiratory therapist and Cobin as a nurse. They moved to Florida in 1986 and also worked together at the Bay Pines VA Hospital in St. Petersburg.



"Thanks to the heartwarming and generous gift from Stanley Anderberg, we are able to support BHC programs and transform BHC students' lives," said Zenaida Landeros, executive director of the Black Hawk College Foundation.

Stanley Anderberg and James Cobin's story is one of love, dedication and generosity. The scholarship created in Cobin's memory will continue their legacy of caring for others and supporting the importance of education.



## QUAD CITY BANK & TRUST CREATES VITAL SCHOLARSHIPS



Beginning with the Fall 2023 semester, each scholarship will cover full tuition, fees and books for two years. The Quad City Bank & Trust Scholarship is available to full-time students of all majors. Recognizing that financial need can keep many students from accessing a postsecondary education, QCBT's goal is to provide access to education to those in need.

## MINI-GRANTS: HELPING STUDENTS THRIVE AT BLACK HAWK COLLEGE



The Black Hawk College Foundation issued six mini-grants—ranging from \$500–\$2,500—to projects benefiting students. These grants aim to enhance academic and personal growth, while underlining the Foundation's commitment to fostering student excellence.

The Black Hawk College Foundation provides support for a range of student-centered initiatives. These include enhancing professional skills, ensuring equal access to education, promoting inclusivity on campus, supporting high school completion, facilitating technology integration in classes, and enhancing the college experience and success for students.

Various faculty members in the department of the Business, Computer and Engineering Technology are utilizing funds to provide enhanced education and support to students across disciplines. From ACCT 123 students gaining QuickBooks II certifications to the Disability Resources & Access employing assistive technologies, efforts to empower continued learning are widespread. Under-represented students are offered a supportive environment through the Multicultural Entrepreneurial Center, while high school and GED® students receive resources to complete studies through Presage's Project Recognize and Incentivize. Professional and Continuing Education is focusing on digital literacy with an investment in iPads for youth classes, and TRIO Student Support Services is concentrating on College Experience success.

## BHC 5K HUSTLE



The Black Hawk College 5K Hustle is a Quad Cities tradition, held annually on the beautiful BHC campus in Moline. Runners, joggers and walkers of all levels enjoy an autumn day on the hills of the college's campus.

Since its inception, the race has raised more than \$50,000 in scholarships for the BHC Physical Therapist Assistant Program.
